


ONE MAN'S STORY

In October of 2014 I moved into a sober living home called Open Door, I had no idea what was about to happen to me. I was to have "vital spiritual experiences that appeared in the nature of huge emotional displacements and rearrangements." When I left the Open Door in May of 2016, my ideas, emotions and attitudes were changed. Today, I'm happily married, I have two beautiful baby girls, I have a family that loves me, I have a good job that I have had for more than 5 years now, I'm enrolled in college working towards an engineering degree, I support myself and am a productive member of society. I am so grateful today. Through the support and encouragement of Open Door's Sober Living Program, the 12 Steps, the fellowship of AA and my sponsor, I live a happy, usefully whole life today!

The following story originally ran in our Spring 2016 edition of "The Door" newsletter. Today, Derek is as fine of a specimen of a manhood as one could wish to meet.

My experience with the Open Door has been something I felt like I've never experienced before. I came there quiet, not knowing anyone, and not having anything but a hand full of clothes with me. From the first day I was told this is your home now and I never felt like it wasn't. What was a journey through up and down, the staff, the men living there, the emphasis of working a 12 step program, and the place which I called home had saved my life. It is truly hard for me to put into words what I experienced while living there.



The fact that I always had someone to talk to, and had as much time as I needed to focus on myself had helped me tremendously. I never knew there was a life worth living sober, and the Open Door helped me find one. They offered me help with rent and did not pressure me to get a job until we felt ready I was ready to go off into the working environment. They helped me to become a brother, a son, a mentor, a friend, and an employee, not only to my job but an employee to God himself. I never had a concept of a Higher Power, but the relationship that I've built, by having time to focus on myself, is a faith that works.

Though my faith has been tested and there were times when my ego could of driven me out of there, I stayed and Dan always helped me see when I was fear driven, which happened a lot. Dan helped me see more of who I am as a person than anyone or even myself has ever shown me. I always felt comfortable, and for that I am grateful.
